# **Mayor's Message**

As we head into October, things continue to look up for Orland Park. An inducement agreement was unanimously approved at the September 21, 2020 Village Board meeting welcoming plans for a new Pete's Fresh Market.

Pete's Fresh Market is anticipating a Spring 2021groundbreaking and plans to open their newest location in Orland Park by Spring 2022. The proposed project includes the redevelopment of the former Art Van building into a 65,000 square foot, full service Pete's Fresh Market grocery store in the Orland Greens Shopping Center located at 15080 South LaGrange Road.

Stephanie Dremonas, Executive Officer at Pete's Fresh Market, was present at the September 21, 2020 Village Board meeting. "We're excited, we're Southsiders," said Dremonas about the plans to open a new store in the former Art Van Furniture location. "We're off to the races...we hope to have all plans in for review by the end of the year."

We are just as excited as the Pete's Fresh Market representatives to have them as a part of our business community. I had the pleasure to meet with Stephanie and her father, James "Jimmy" Dremonas recently. You can tell the passion and love that the Dremonas family has for their business. This is a great addition to the Village of Orland Park. It shows everyone that Orland Park is the place businesses want to be, even during a pandemic.

Thank you to everyone who was able to join us at the recent Village of Orland Park Veteran's Golf Classic at Silver Lake Country Club. We had a great turnout, lots of fun and most importantly, were able to raise funds for local veterans' organizations.

Currently, we offer two programs:

### **Incredible Opportunity Program**

The Incredible Opportunity Program (IOP) is our beginner ensemble, a group instruction class, for students ages 8-13 who do not have a string program offered at their school and who do not already play a string instrument, but would like to learn to play a violin. To be considered for IOP, students must submit a short essay titled, "Why I Want to Play the Violin" to thesyso@gmail.com.

General Program Description: for 2020-2021, if accepted, students receive weekly instruction via Zoom on Sunday afternoon and a weekly streamed class on our Facebook page

Total program cost for 2020-2021 season is \$280 plus a \$15 materials fee (book and shoulder pad). A rental violin will be provided if needed at no additional cost. Financial aid is available to qualified students. For more information email thesyso@gmail.com.

# **Suburban Youth Symphony Orchestra**

Our top performing ensemble provides orchestra training for students that already play a string instrument with confidence. Students play different styles of music and further develop reading, rhythm, and ensemble skills, and learn how conducting works. In addition, they receive a master class as well as coaching from highly trained classical musicians during a chamber music segment mid-season.

General Program Description: Rehearsals are held Sunday afternoons at St. Peter's Church in Frankfort, Illinois, currently in small group format adhering to Covid protocol 3-5:30PM, beginning in September and running through the beginning of May.

Total program cost is \$420 for September through April or \$235 per semester. Financial aid is available to qualified students.

# **Orland Secretary of State's Office**

Orland Township welcomed the Secretary of State's Office to the Administration building last month. Since announcing in June that they would be relocating to the Township building, my office has fielded numerous calls every day asking when it would open, what services would be available, etc. The Secretary of State opened to the public a few weeks earlier than anticipated and Orland Township is very happy to be able to accommodate their relocated facility. Based on the number of clients they serve on a daily basis and the positive feedback from residents, sharing our building space was the right thing to do for the community. The Orland Secretary of State Office is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. For more information on the services available, go to cyberdriveillinois.com.

### Flu Season

Don't forget to get your flu shot! Orland Township's flu shot clinics began in early September and will be held at the Township, 14807 S. Ravinia Ave., every Monday and Wednesday from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., through the end of October (except Monday, Oct. 12 when the office is closed in observance of Columbus Day).

Flu shots will also be available during early voting. Please see our website, orlandtownship.org for more information, including applicable fees.

# **Early Voting**

The Orland Township Administration Building, 14807 S. Ravinia Ave., will serve as an early voting site from Monday, Oct. 19 through Monday, Nov. 2. Early voting hours will be Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturdays and Sundays, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The health and safety of everyone - voters, election volunteers and staff - is of utmost importance. During early voting, mask wearing, social distancing, hourly cleaning of high traffic areas and other measures will be strictly followed to help prevent the spread of the virus.

For voters taking advantage of the state's vote-by-mail program, the Cook County Clerk's Office will have a secure drop box on-site for those who would like to deliver their ballots directly to the Cook County Clerk's Office. All aspects of the drop box will be managed by the early voting judges appointed by the Cook County Clerk's Office, including the location within the Township building and the evening pick-up from the drop box.

With so many options to cast your ballot, I encourage everyone to be sure to exercise their right to vote.

# **Dos & Don'ts of Social Media Marketing**

With the holiday season coming quickly, local businesses should start working on their game plan to have a strong social media presence. Below are a few tips to help them have a successful holiday season.

### The Dos

- **Do** post consistently to your social media channels.
- **Do** use photos or video that are engaging and reflect your brand.
- **Do** check your insights to ensure you are posting at times that will yield higher engagement.
- **Do** remember to update your hours or any service changes or closures on social media as well as your Google listing on your Google My Business page.
- **Do** keep in mind that nearly 46%\* of Facebook users never log in to the desktop site so make sure your page is optimized for mobile devices. \*Source: Buffer.com
- **Do** have a plan! Determine what type of content you want on your social channels and create a monthly calendar.

### The Don'ts

- **Don't** post just to post. Posting content unrelated to your brand can be a turnoff to your customers which can lead to them unfollowing you.
- **Don't** engage with customer issues online. Get it offline as quickly as possible. Ask for an email or phone number, and handle outside your social media channels.
- **Don't** post during your off-hours (8 p.m.-8 a.m. for most businesses).
- **Don't** give yourself another job title as social media coordinator if you are the business owner or manager. Have an employee or hire a reputable company or freelancer to help you.
- **Don't** forget to practice before filming a video post. Don't be that person that is giving us a view up their nose.
- **Don't** forget to read through the fine details of any marketing contract. Know what you are signing up for with your business.



# **The Sitting Epidemic**

In today's climate, many of us find ourselves sitting in front of a computer or tablet for hours at a time. This includes those who are working from home, completing e-learning, or performing Telemedicine visits like myself. The human body is not built for prolonged periods of sitting. Most of us also enjoy getting comfy in a slouched position in our seats, which puts a lot of pressure on our low back and spine in general. Additions to your daily lifestyle will help resolve or prevent back pain associated with prolonged periods of time. My first tip would be to properly position yourself when seated. Take a seat at the end of your chair and scoot your hips all the way to the backing of your chair, so they are the first thing to contact the back of the chair. Next you lean back into the chair and maintain an upright posture. This position is called supported neutral, which occurs when the back of your chair supports your spine. Another tip to maintain the curve in your low back is to use a lumbar support pillow. If you don't have one, you can easily make one by rolling up a towel. When you have your lumbar support, scoot back into your chair and place it just above your hips. Sit upright and you are all set to go. Furthermore, make time to get up and walk around, as the human body was created to move! Walking helps decrease the build up of pressure in the discs of your spine that is caused from sitting. Lastly, stretching will also help prevent low back pain. End range loading exercises have been proven to be very efficacious to help with low back pain. On a hard surface, lay on your stomach, and then push up only using your arms. Your pelvis and legs should remain on the floor at all times. Perform this movement for 15 repetitions a couple times a day to break up prolonged periods of sitting. For more information visit www.medihealthwellness.com!
