Mayor's Message

We are always looking for new ways to provide resources to our local businesses. One new development that we have implemented is the Village's new economic development website, buildop.org. The new site provides dynamic data and sophisticated mapping technologies to help expanding businesses.

Market data shows that more than 98% of site selectors and businesses are researching location data online, often before making contact with the public organization. With that in mind, the Village designed and launched buildop.org to be a digital resource for the business and development community.

The website's main feature is a data center powered by ZoomProspector. This tool gives users access to in-depth information ranging from demographic, labor force and industry data to available sites & buildings in the Village. Other features include a Developer's Toolkit that provides resources - such as the Village's GIS zoning map and development regulations - and an Initiatives page that highlights key projects and programs ongoing in the Village.

We hope that you will visit the site, take a look at the many available resources and data, and let us know if there is anything more you would like to see added that may be of benefit to local businesses.

Safety remains a top priority of the Village of Orland Park. We are blessed to have an outstanding police department in the Village that continuously upholds the highest standards and makes the safety of residents, visitor and businesses their top priority. The Chief of Police recently gave a semi-annual update on crime statistics at the meeting of the Village Board and I am happy to report that index crimes are down another 17% in 2021 after record low crime in 2020. Violent crime is also down 28% from last year. Aggravated battery against our officers and domestic battery crimes have dropped, driving this decrease. Additionally, property crimes are down substantially largely driven by the youth supervision policy was implemented at the mall. The Orland Square Mall remains the safest mall in the Chicagoland area, as it has been for years and the implementation of the new policy has made it even safer.

Motor vehicle thefts are slightly higher than they were at this time last year with the majority stemming from key fobs left in unlocked vehicles. The police continue their social media and marketing campaign, 9PM Routine, which encourages residents to lock their vehicles and take their keys/key fobs into their homes.



Holiday Program Begins

The Orland Township Food Pantry is providing Thanksgiving Turkey Dinners, and Holiday Dinners and gifts to Orland Township families in need. Eligibility for these programs is based on income guidelines. Families in need can begin to register Friday, Oct. 1.

Thanksgiving Turkey Dinners must register on or before distributions day, Saturday, Nov. 20. Dinners are while supplies lasts.

Holiday Program registration ends Wednesday, Dec. 1. Families should bring toy and gift ideas (gifts should not exceed \$30). Gifts are provided for ages 12 and under, gifts for over age 12 will be distributed upon availability. Adults are not promised gifts.

To apply for the Thanksgiving Turkey Dinner and/or the Holiday Program, residents must complete a brief application and provide the following:

- Proof of Residency. Must show picture ID with correct address for all family members ages 18 and older. (Driver's License or Secretary of State ID).
- Verification of Household Income. Income statement from last 30 days or unemployment documentation
- Birth Certificates of Child/Children Residing in the household. Medical card or school verification is also acceptable.

Teen Center Launching Empowering Teens Month in November

For the last 10 years, The Bridge Teen Center (in partnership with their sister organization, The Bridge Thrift Store) has recognized National Bullying Prevention Awareness Month through a variety of successful events and community-centered initiatives. Although bullying remains an active part of many teens' lives, The Bridge Teen Center's latest initiative is designed to celebrate and raise awareness of real solutions to the struggles teens are facing in our changed world instead of amplifying a single issue.

For the last decade, The Bridge's holistic perspective has helped students discover their gifts, talents, likes, dislikes and potential through a wide variety of free programs and events. This year, The Bridge, along with many individuals and businesses in the community, will celebrate this widespread impact.

Empowering Teens Month will be held in November with a goal of raising awareness of the importance of holistically-designed afterschool programs like those offered by The Bridge. Most importantly, this initiative will celebrate the undeniable impact effective afterschool programs have on teens locally and nationally. Since 2010, The Bridge has successfully engaged, connected and empowered more than 10,500 different students from 128 communities. The Bridge also stands as a model for afterschool programs all over the world, and continually provides support to groups and organizations with similar missions.

Empowering Teens Month will give the community the opportunity to show their support of The Bridge's mission through group volunteer opportunities and month-long sponsorship opportunities. In years past, large companies, small businesses, church groups and others have rallied together in support of our local teens. In addition to raising funds to support the Teen Center's free programs, a month-long awareness campaign will educate the public about how afterschool programs effectively empower teens. Special "on mission" themed programs for teens will also be offered by the Teen Center throughout the year.

During Empowering Teens Month, there are three ways for the community to get involved: Shop - The Bridge Thrift Store processes hundreds of bags of donated goods each month, with a large volume expected in November. Store inventory is changing daily, and there are great finds every single day.
