## CEO's Message

As we start the new year, I want to take a moment to reflect on what has truly been a remarkable time of growth and renewed focus for the Orland Park Area Chamber of Commerce. Together, we have strengthened our role as a connector, collaborator, and advocate for businesses of every size, while strengthening our partnerships with the Village of Orland Park, the local school district, and many other valued community partners. One of the most exciting changes last year was the transition of our Monthly Membership Meetings into Lunch and Learns. Introduced in August, this shift immediately resonated with members. Attendance has grown steadily each month, and the energy in the room has been inspiring. With speakers already secured through September 2026 and a consistent meeting time and location established, we are well positioned to continue building on this momentum.

Our partnership with the Village of Orland Park grew a lot in 2025. Chamber and Village staff now meet monthly to discuss community needs, new businesses, and broader economic development priorities. Additionally, OPACC now provides an update at the second Village Board meeting each month, keeping elected officials informed of new members, ongoing programs, and emerging partnerships. Membership growth has been another standout achievement. By year's end, we welcomed 108 new members! This is up from 82 in 2024 and almost double our 2023 total. Beginning in 2026, Chamber and Village staff will jointly visit new businesses each month to welcome them to Orland Park and introduce them to the many resources available through OPACC.

Last year, we also celebrated the successful launch of our 2026 Community Calendar, which quickly became a favorite among residents and members alike. Featuring historic Village photos, notable dates in Orland Park's history, Chamber events, and key 1776-related dates in recognition of America 250, the calendar showcases the pride and heritage of our community. Building on that success, we have already begun work on our next major publication, the 2026 Community Guide, scheduled for release in mid-spring.

As we look ahead in 2026, our commitment remains clear. It is to support local businesses, build meaningful connections, and serve as a trusted resource for the entire Orland Park community. With strong partnerships, a growing membership, and a shared sense of purpose, we enter the new year with confidence and excitement for what lies ahead.

# EARLY VOTING

## Early Voting Location Moves to Orland Park Civic Center for Upcoming Election Cycle

The Village of Orland Park is pleased to announce that for the next early voting cycle, early voting will relocate from the Orland Township Building to the Orland Park Civic Center, located at 14750 S. Ravinia Ave. This change reflects the Village's continued commitment to improving voter access, comfort, and efficiency while ensuring a smooth and secure early voting experience for residents.

"The Civic Center allows us to better serve voters in a way that is accessible, efficient, and welcoming," said Orland Park Village Clerk Mary Ryan Norwell. "This move is about removing barriers to participation and making early voting as easy and comfortable as possible for our residents."

The Civic Center offers several advantages that make it well suited to serve as an early voting location. Its central location and ample parking provide ease of access, while the fully accessible interior ensures voters of all ages and abilities can participate comfortably.

"One of the most important improvements is the ability to keep voters indoors," Norwell said. "By moving early voting to the Civic Center, we can significantly reduce outdoor lines and minimize the impact of weather, which has been a concern during past early voting periods."

Unlike the previous setup at the Orland Township Building, the Civic Center offers a larger, more flexible interior space that allows election officials to better manage voter flow. The layout supports clearer wayfinding, efficient check-in, and appropriately spaced voting stations, helping to reduce wait times while maintaining voter privacy and security.

"The additional space gives election workers the room they need to operate efficiently and ensures voters can move through the process comfortably and confidently," Norwell said. "It ultimately creates a better experience for everyone involved."

Village officials worked closely with election administrators to ensure the transition maintains the integrity and accessibility of early voting while delivering meaningful improvements for the community. The move is intended to support higher turnout, accommodate peak voting periods, and enhance overall operations.

"Early voting plays a vital role in our democratic process," Norwell said. "By hosting it at the Civic Center, we are reinforcing our commitment to civic engagement and making sure residents have a positive and accessible place to cast their ballots."

Additional details regarding early voting dates, hours, and parking information will be shared as the next election cycle approaches. Residents are encouraged to stay informed through Village communications and official election resources.


# MEMBER HOLIDAY PARTY RECAP






